At Mary's Meals, we believe in the power of a meal. Our 20 years of experience has shown us that a daily school meal has hugely positive immediate and long-term improvements to a child's life. - ▶ We serve those suffering most acutely the effects of hunger, those who are most likely to miss school because of hunger, and those who are marginalised and neglected
- ▶ Our programmes are owned and run by local communities and thousands of volunteers who share our vision
- ▶ Mary's Meals is conscious of the need to minimise the environmental impact of our activities. We strive to prevent, reduce and control the risk of environmental harm in all of our programmes
- ▶ We keep our running costs low to allow us to reach as many children as possible. We are committed to minimizing our environmental impact and promoting sustainability in our programmes
- ▶ We make a long-term commitment to the communities we support because we recognise that the benefits of education can take a long time to materialise

FACT FILE

MALAWI

We are currently feeding more than 1 million children in Malawi. A typical school meal consists of a corn and soya blend porridge fortified with essential minerals and vitamins, known locally as “likuni phala”.

Malawi is where our school feeding programme began and where our first meals were served in 2003. We have grown from those early days, serving 200 children in two primary schools, and now reach more than 1 million children every school day.

Malawi is our largest programme and is delivered by Mary’s Meals Malawi alongside a local partner, MCSPA. The programme can reach so many children because of tens of thousands of volunteers from local communities who give their time freely to prepare and serve our nutritious meals.

Malawi has consistently high levels of food insecurity, and communities are increasingly susceptible to the effects of climate change. The majority of families rely on smallholder farming. Droughts and flooding are leaving many of them at risk.

Mary’s Meals operates in the majority of districts in Malawi and our programme is strongly supported by the Government of Malawi. Most schools receiving Mary’s Meals are in the Southern Region, but large numbers of children are also supported in the Central and Northern regions.



- ▶ In Malawi, 34.9% of children under five have stunted growth.
- ▶ A staggering 70.06% of the population live below the international poverty line of \$2.15 USD a day.

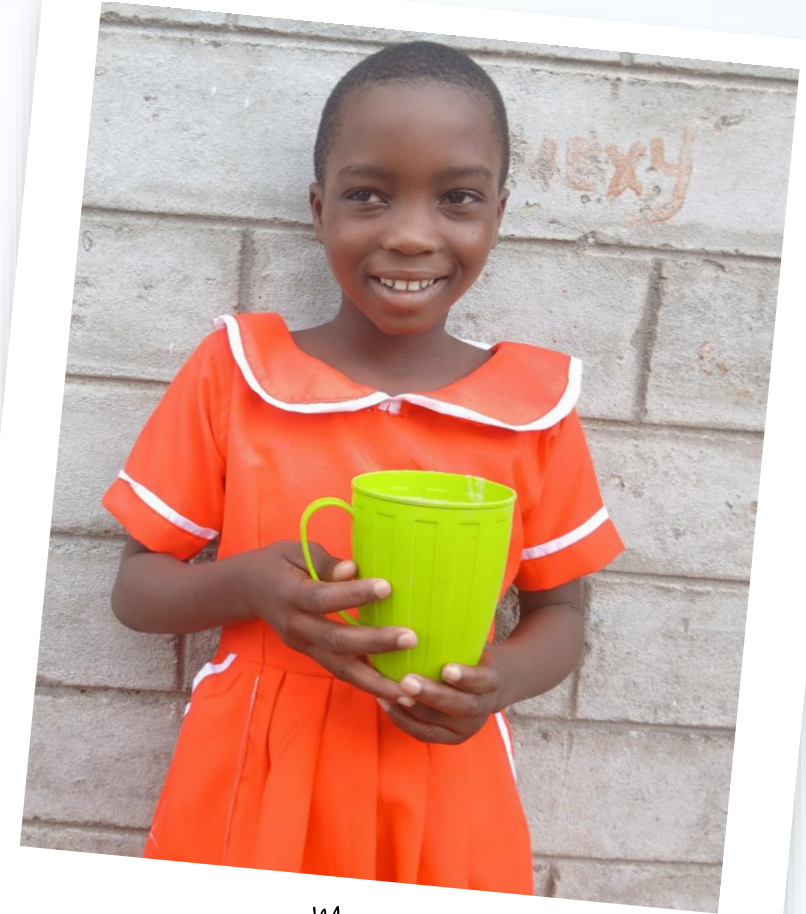

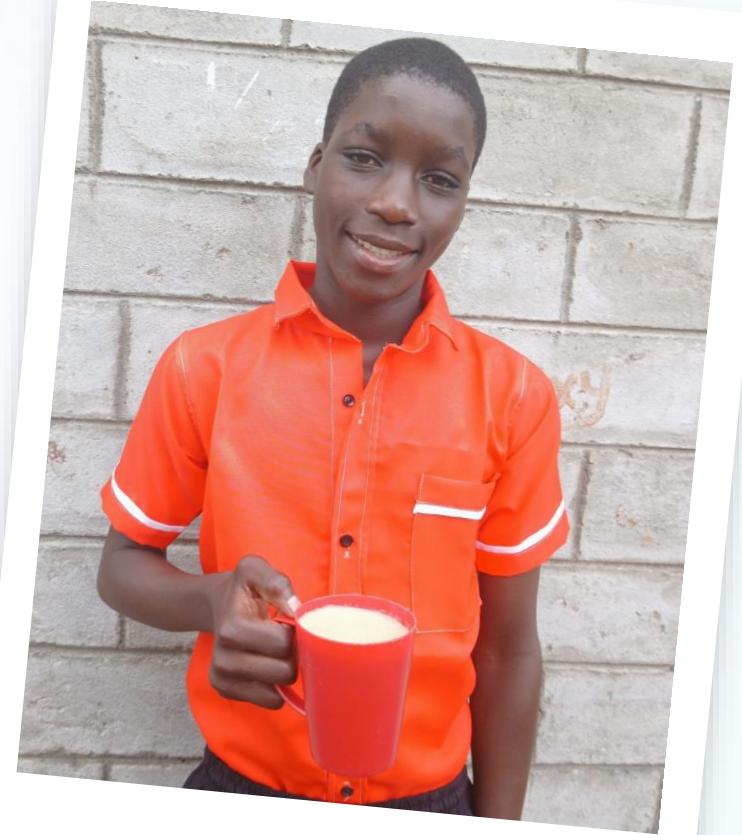

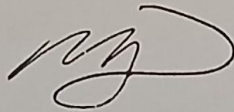
